# Some insights from Mario Draghi's report



#### Fragmentation ⇒ loss of competitiveness

- Duplication, incompatible standards (telecom, GDPR, railway)
- Fragmentation of financial instruments that prevents large-scale investments
- Fragmentation in energy, innovation, trade, defence politics



### EU share dropped (22% ⇒ 18%)

- While that of the United States increased (30%  $\rightarrow$  38%)
- Increased global competition




#### UNITY ⇒ Multiplier effect

 Acting together allows the EU to leverage its collective strength (public purchasing power, diplomatic weight, internal market).



#### Recognition vs. Contribution:

 Many EU organizations see open source benefits, but few actively contribute—only 34% have a strategy and 22% a dedicated unit (OSPO).

#### Digital Sovereignty:

 Open source is key for EU digital autonomy, yet investments, strategies, and political coordination are lacking.



#### Management Gap:


 86% of staff see its value, but only 62% of top management do.
