About the direction that we want Jakarta you to go in and provide our input to them as.

And their planning cycles are typically shorter so.

Our our goal is to be longer term thinking and outside the box.

Without that repo in place.

I don't think there's a whole lot of activity that we can do today, but I'd like to open it up to.

I have a question about. So I remember in the document we mentioned a few areas that we could explore and they sound all very interesting.

How how's going to be the problem of actually exploring? Are we going to be talking to industry representatives to see what they think about each of those areas or are we going to talk to implementers to see whether they would agree to a standard? So what's going to be the next step?

Great, great question. I I think those are definitely a couple of options on the table

for how we pursue it. I think we capture the initial idea and then I I anticipate having somebody who is effectively taking ownership, they may not do the work, but they they at least can coordinate getting other people involved.

And and then.

I think we have some resources.

Within our individual teams and you know as individuals contacts and so on, I think we can determine how we socialise the ideas.

You know, on an individual basis?

I I don't. You know we we haven't any got any budget for reaching out to analysts or anything like that but certainly that.

The the idea of.

Looking doing the research around.

The you know, possible analyst reports and all that kind of.

External information and then coalescing that into the the issue.

I think that'll be part of the responsibility of the.

The owner of the issue, you know, we'll we'll hopefully have people signing up to take ownership of.

Each of the issues going in that that we're prioritising and then they can work with others, you know, get a team together to.

Divide and conquer the the research.

So what I think Abraham was mainly focusing on is let's say if we decide to tackle from the technical perspective EJBS or AI, let let let's say it doesn't matter what exactly are the high level steps. So as as we are the interest group, we really ought to. Give our strong recommendations to the Jakarta Working Group and.

To be more specific.

Probably steering committee and therefore later on the platform team.

Who will then take that recommendation and discuss how to technically actually implement and how that fits? Whether it's one of the profiles, it's a platform or or it's standalone specification that needs to be created like we.

We really need to be collaborating with technical teams that will actually do it and for the time being, those technical teams from the Jakarta EE perspective are directly tied into Djokarte working group. That's part of the reason also why this interest group is the Jakarta E future directions so.

Even through the name, we're clearly indicating that it is very much related to the Jakarta E Working group.

But currently that working group is focusing on current or the immediate release where this body wants to be even bigger and explore what are the industry friends and therefore.

A dream about the direction that the Ducati working group should really look into and engage with their technical team.

That doesn't mean just to add that if we start a true deep technical discussion, we will not involve someone from the technical team to take part in the particular issue or a particular topic that is being discussed here at the interest group. But I just want to draw obvious collaboration between.

The working group and the interest group, if that helps at all. Abraham.
