EF Project Leadership Chain

Project Leads

- Management, technical leadership
- Primary liaison with PMC and EMO

Project Management Committee (PMC)

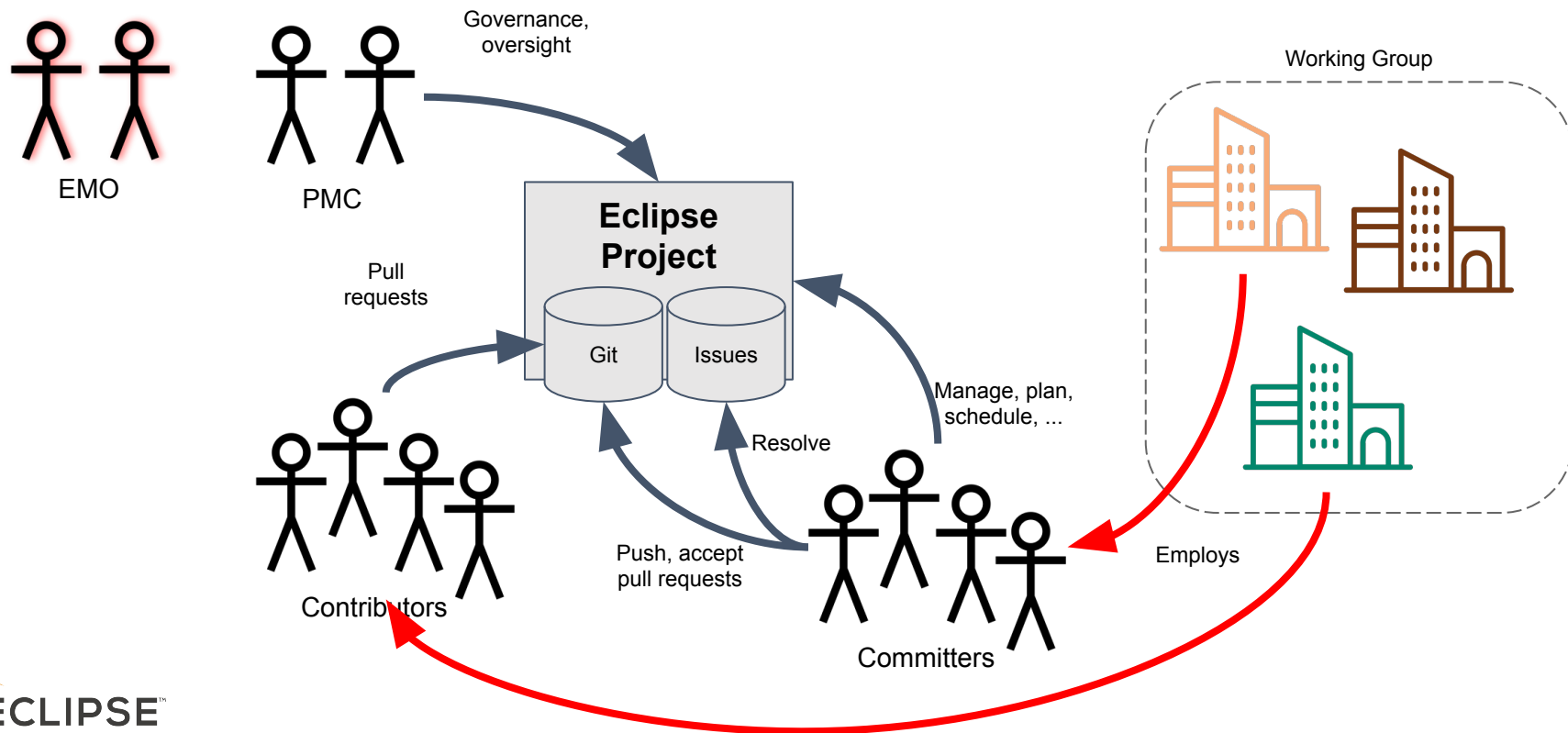
- Technical approval of IP contributions, releases
- Project oversight, general responsibility

EMO

- Overall responsibility to manage processes and maintain services
- Eclipse Foundation Staff, Architecture Council

EMO (ED)

Who's Who?



Project Management Committee

- Provides oversight and overall leadership for Projects under their Top-Level Project
- Ensure that the EDP is understood and followed by their Projects

Project Management Committee

- Ensure **effective operation** of projects:
 - removing obstacles, solving problems, and resolving conflicts
- Promote **OS rules of engagement**: meritocracy, transparency and openness
- Ensure projects **conform to the Eclipse Foundation IP policy** and procedures.

Project Management Committee

Exceptional situations

- projects with no active Committers/PLs
- disruptive Committers

The Project Leadership Chain can:

- make changes (add, remove) to the set of Committers and/or PLs
- act on behalf of the Project Lead

When we ask a PMC +1 we expect you:

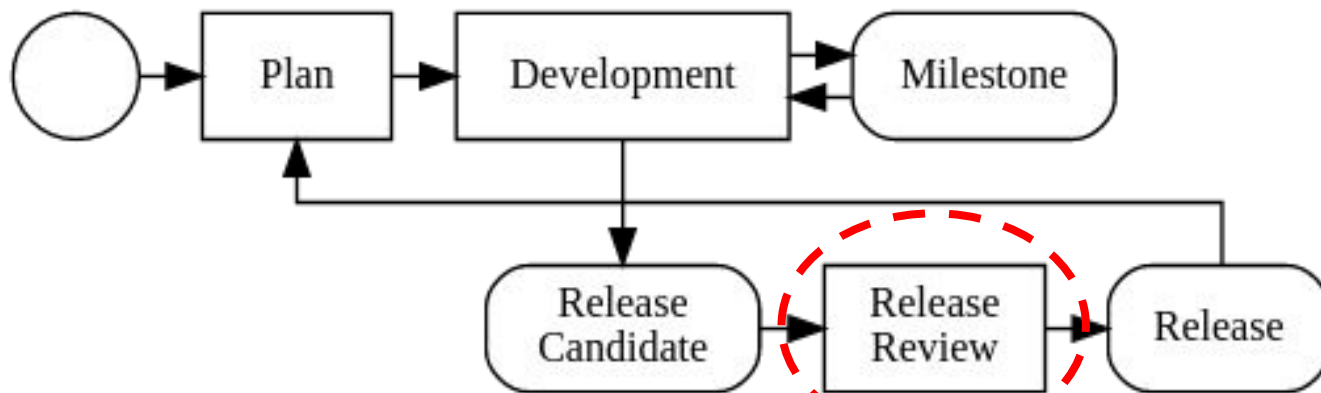
- Use your knowledge and experience with community & technology to provide deep technical insights
- Raise issues and concerns

What we don't expect:

- The PMC doing the work of the IP team

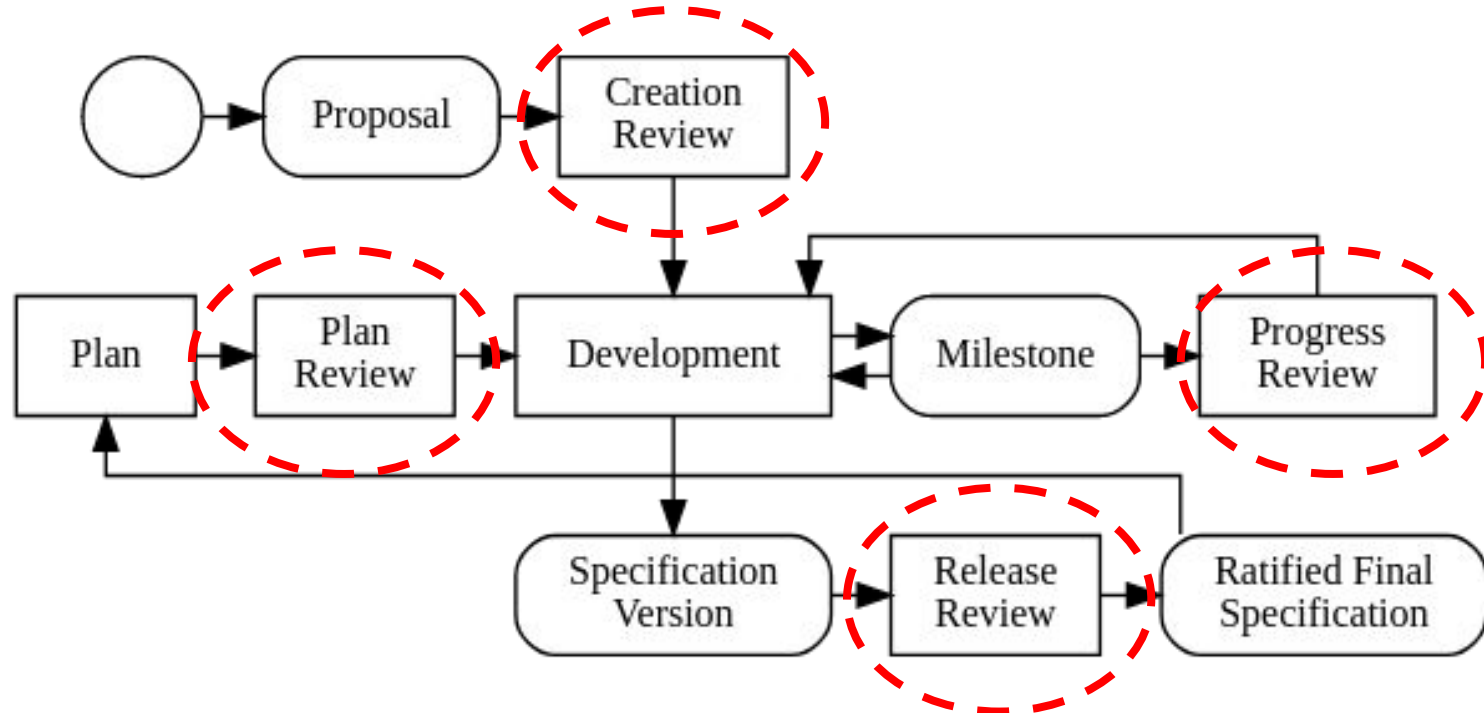
Releases and Reviews

Releases



At least once every year

Releases (Specifications)



Specification committee
ballot approval required

Releases

- Major/minor releases
 - Progress or Release review once per year
 - IP Log approval (as part of the review, not for each release)
 - Plan to spend time planning/documenting release
- Service/Bugfix-only releases
 - No review
 - No IP Log approval
- The IP Policy must be observed for all releases
 - All IP must be resolved by the due diligence process

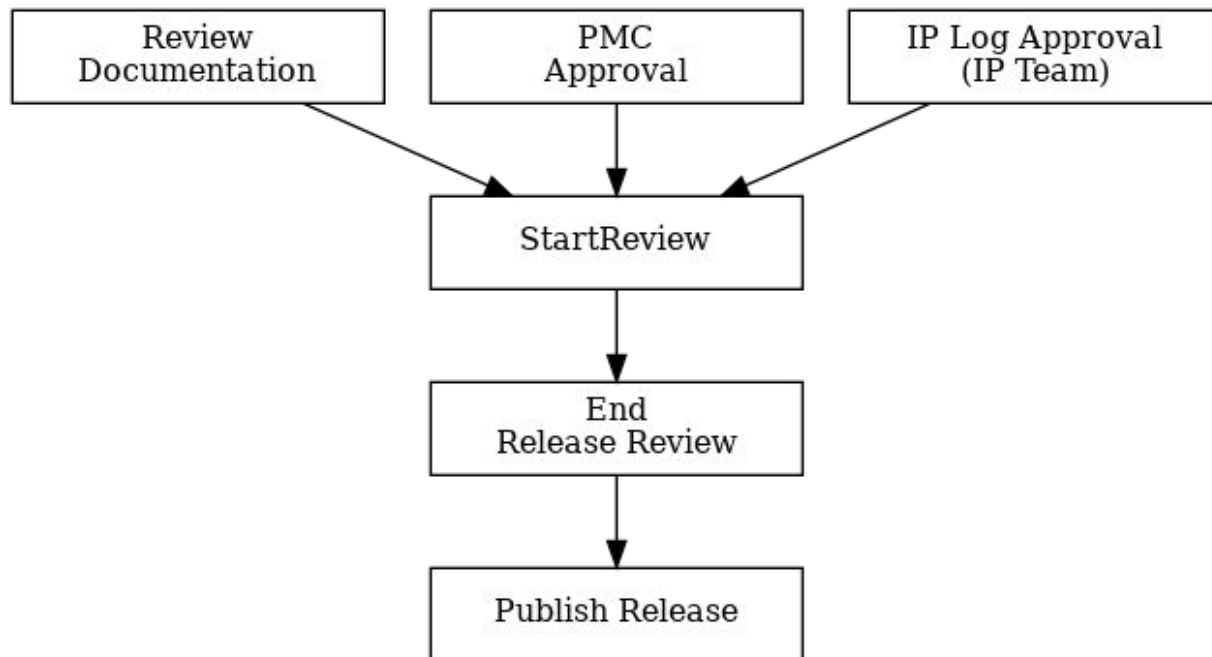

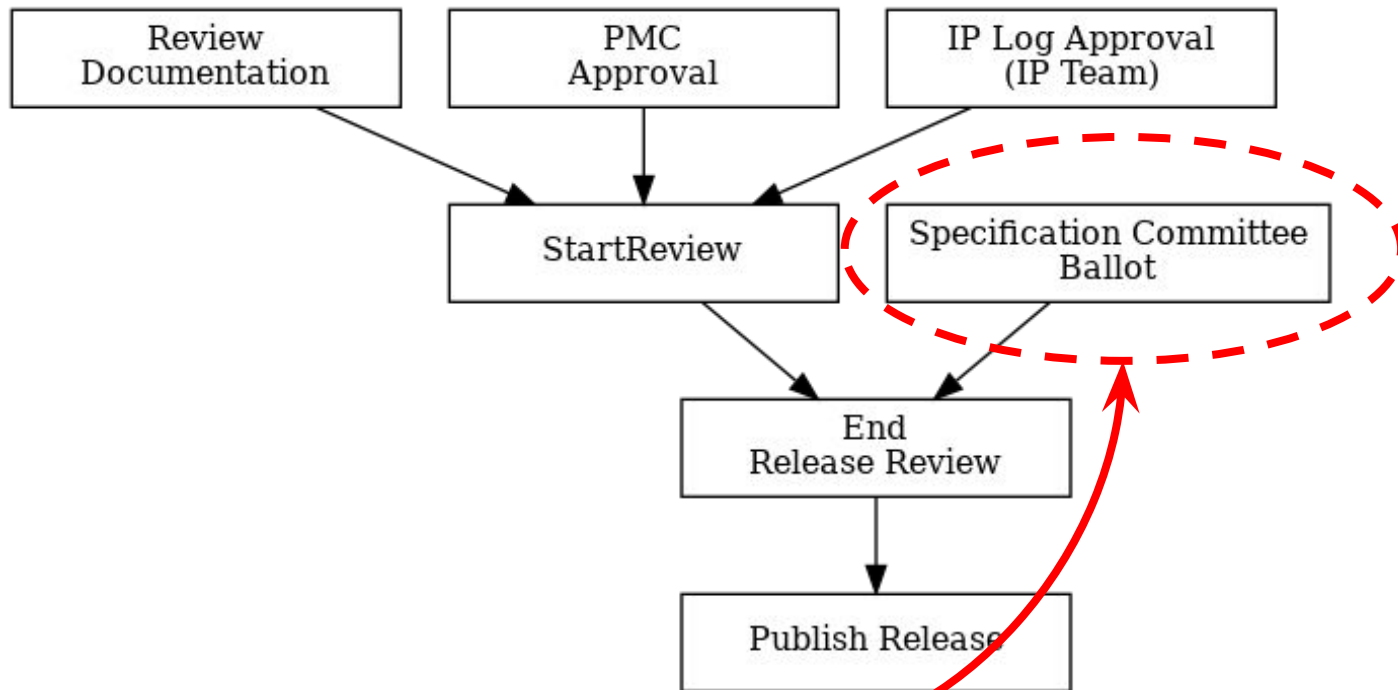

approval required


Becoming a Committer

Meritocracy by contribution

- Committer status is not automatic
- Establish a pattern of contribution
- Committer nominates

Committer Election

- Define trust;
- Maintain vendor/employer neutrality; and
- Operate transparently
