### Context sensitive personlized information from all kinds of files and databases







### The Challenge

- → Present information in a meaningful way










- 2. Cooperate to jointly implement and maintain a connector pool

  - ✓ Indexing








## The SMILA @ eclipse

- ✓ The difficulties we have demonstrate how important the process is to us and our customers!




